Museum of the Rockies



600 W Kagy Blvd, Bozeman, MT 59717

Renowned for its extensive collection of dinosaur fossils, including a full-scale T-Rex skeleton. Also features regional history exhibits, a planetarium, and changing exhibits from around the world. Must-see: The Siebel Dinosaur Complex.

Gallatin History Museum

Located in a former county jail, this museum offers a glimpse into Gallatin County's heritage with exhibits on Native American history, old Fort Ellis, and more. Must-see: The historical jail cells and gallows.
